STORM DAMAGE AT WATTS BRIDGE



On Saturday afternoon 16th of December 2006 three storm cells converged over the airfield locality causing severe damage to many buildings in the surrounding area. Worst affected was John and Tanys McCarron's hangar which was blown away, destroying the Drifter stored inside. Other buildings, including the QUA hangar had doors blown in or other minor damage. The storm cells also damaged buildings in Kilcoy and Cooroy / Tewantin as they continued on their path. Wind speed recorded as it passed Double Island Point was 195 kilometers per hour. Two other vintage aircraft were also damaged.



Above photos show damage to the QUA Hangar. Main damage is to the doors, fittings and some side wall panels. Photo on the right shows the remains of John and Tanys's unfortunate hangar with rolled up Drifter remnants below. The Drifter was destroyed. Bottom right photo shows the wing of a Tiger Moth clipped by a door on the vintage hangar. The doors at the other end were blown off. The QVAG Clubhouse suffered roof damage from the flying debris.





QUA HANGAR REPORT

Fortunately the five aircraft stored in the QUA hangar suffered no damage when the building was damaged. Nor was anyone seriously hurt by the flying debris, considering that QVAG members were setting up for their Christmas party at the time. One member, Shane Winter, was stuck outside during the storm and was unable to return to the safety of the clubhouse due to the very strong winds. He had to hang on and wait for the winds to drop in speed. The next day a team of people worked together to start the clean up process and to assess the damage. The following Saturday a small team of QUA members secured the hangar by bolting up the damaged doors so that the aircraft were safe from vandalism and theft of components. It is estimated the hangar will be repaired by the end of February, thanks to the insurance company and Chris Gratton Sheds.
