Engine Conversions & Conversion Kits

Auto Engines General Information

Modern auto engines are light, have a high reliability and life time. Electronic ignition and fuel injection with microprocessor control systems, low gas consumption and flight hour expenses, simple and inexpensive maintenance with an attractive unit price. These features usually distinguish converted auto engines from their "real aviation" brothers.





There is a lot of experience in the converting of Subaru, Honda, Chevy, Nissan and other engines but the light and small Suzuki 1 litre is the most interesting engine for me as an ultralight triker. There are several companies that are converting this engine; for example Raven Rotor or Joplin Light Aircraft. This engine with fuel injection has the same 64-65 h.p. as the popular Rotax 582 model. A Trike with a Holden Barina / Suzuki Swift engine has very good flight performances with significantly lower flight hour costs. Its TBO is about 1000 hours. Its alternator and starter plus a lightweight battery allow you to start easier in any weather, have lights, radio, intercom etc. Electronic control modules with sensors are easy to fit to allow different temperature, altitude, humidity, and gas quality. The engine will be working with a minor loss of power. You will not need to spend a lot of your time on its conversion to achieve an economical powerplant.

Suzuki Power Group Conversion Kits

The gearbox life time is 1000 to 2500 hours, (depends on the engine power and the prop moment of inertia). Its manufacturer advises to change bearings after 1000 hours. About 300 gearbox sets have been made and delivered to the end of 2004. Some of them have 600 to 700 operating hours. This system is well proven. My customers and I have never had any problem with these gearboxes. I have never even opened one. One of my customers opened one after about 250 running hours. "Looks like new inside", he said. The body consists of three bolted together parts: #1) gearbox with the gear and oil inside, #2) damper part, #3) mount plate for the gearbox installation to the engine. This part is different for different model (Suzuki or Subaru) engines.

This gearbox was designed for aviation conversion of engines up to 180 h.p. It has been in production since 2000. The available reduction ratios are 2.03, 2.34, 2.5. There is a German (BMW) rubber damper between the gear box and the engine.

The propeller moment of inertia up to 9,000 kg/cm2. Rotax-style propeller hub, propeller shaft with a hole. It is possible to use this gearbox for both (tractor and pusher) layouts. A hollow output shaft allows for variable pitch prop.

.The advantages of this conversion kit are its big TBO and reliability, with the possibility of using heavy propellers. Using this kit, you don't need to change belts and pay for them. You don't need to modify the engine block so the mechanical part of conversion is very simple - just bolting the gearbox up. You will keep a stock water outlet with thermostat. I heard a lot about overheating problem from people using conversions with modified water cooling system but have never had it even with my small radiator closed by BRS system. It is also its high efficiency. For example, I got 375lbs of static thrust from my stock unmodified engine with a 2.5 RR gearbox and low noise 69" 3-blade carbon propeller. Now we provide not only conversion kits but also ready-to-install power plants based on low-mileage stock or completely remanufactured and modified GEO-Suzuki engines. We also sell gearbox conversion kits for the Subaru EA-71 EA-82 EJ-18 EJ-20 EJ-22.

If it flys - we'd love you to join in the fun!!


Here's what you have to do:
