Ron Wheeler's Scout Ultralight That Changed Aviation Forever.

In the 1960's a new sport of towing a kite on floats behind a fast power boat was developed by John Dickenson in Grafton, New South Wales, using a simple wing design by Francis Rogallo and incorporating an A-frame weight shift control system and aluminium / Dacron construction. From this basic design, modern hang gliding quickly developed with help from people like Bill Moyes and Bill Bennett. The start of a new era in sport flying quickly mushroomed world wide as designers looked at ways to build more efficient designs. Sydney boatbuilder and hang glider pilot Ron Wheeler designed the Tweetie glider in the early 1970's. The Tweetie became the Scout ultralight when a converted Victa lawnmower engine was fitted in 1975. With much encouragement from Ron, the new 95.10 ultralight legislation was released in 1976. This was the first legislation of its kind world wide and the Wheeler Scout was the first production ultralight aircraft with over two hundred examples sold. A new era in recreational flying dawned worldwide as new designs appeared overnight. This new enthusiasm has seen the cycle of light aircraft development be completely reinvented once more as new designs became heavier, faster, more practical and sophisticated. With new legislation being introduced to keep pace with this growth, what aircraft like the Scout started, has seen a total re-make of the lighter side of recreational aviation and training systems that is re-defining the lighter side of non commercial General Aviation world wide. We owe much to pioneers like Ron Wheeler in challenging the boundaries of government legislators and existing technologies to introduce this on going revolution in sport aviation.

MYSTERY AIRCRAFT





Last month's mystery aircraft is still a mystery. It is a Verhees Delta designed and built by Bart Verhees in Belgium. The design brief was to design a very small, fast aircraft with a large cockpit space. The configuration is an all metal, delta, flying wing with a very thick wing section at the wing root. With a Hirth 65h.p. engine, top speed is 140 knots with a climb rate of 1,300 fpm. The aircraft has been taken to and flown at several air rallies in Europe and England. From the video on You-Tube a long runway is required for take off. The aircraft was registered in France as there was little interest in Belgium.
