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The **Piper Cub** certainly needs no introduction to aviation enthusiasts world wide. Since its introduction in the mid 1930's, thousands were built in the next decade with production continuing into the 1980's. Along the way, performance improved as the design was developed. This process continues today as companies such as **Cub Crafters** work at keeping the older examples flying and producing new Cub kits and production aircraft. Our aircraft of the month is the new Carbon Cub kit plane produced by Cub Crafters in the USA. For local pilots, a vintage **L4 Cub** from WW2 is available for tail dragger training and hire from Caboolture Recreational Aviation. Alternatively a very low time 1945 **J3 Cub** is for sale at Watts Bridge by Shane Winter. Other local companies, such as **M.E.L.T**. Aviation sell the 75% scale **Cubby** two seat replica from South Africa. The Cubby can use a Jabiru 2200 engine to give reasonable performance similar to the original **J3 Cub**. Other **Cub** replica kits and plans are also available for this popular, almost ageless design.

### AIRCRAFT OF THE MONTH

### CARBON CUB REPLICA KIT BY CUBCRAFTERS



The **Carbon Cub** is the modern day Super Cub. It is manufactured using precision CNC machining equipment and lightweight composite materials. Combine this with it's stronger, simpler design and you have an airplane that will takeoff shorter, fly faster, and land shorter than the venerable Super Cub ever did. It is nearly 200 Lbs lighter than an equivalent Super Cub due to it's modern aluminum wing structure and it's completely redesigned fuselage. This results in awesome take-off and landing performance and higher payloads. The much cleaner cowl and streamlined fuselage can result in 140 MPH or more in cruise. It is also much easier to get into and out of because of the redesigned, much larger and wider door. The Carbon Cub is assembled as an Experimental Amateur-Built aircraft by the builder. Engines, mounts, and cowlings are available to support engine installations ranging from the 100 Hp Continental for the LSA "eligible" model to a fire breathing IO-360 Lycoming for the adrenalin challenged. The Carbon Cub flown at the Valdez STOL contest in 2007 took off there in **NINETEEN FEET** and took home the first place prize. You decide what you want. A nimble delightful aircraft legal to fly as a "Light Sport" pilot, or a "Monster Cub" with a power to weight ratio nearly that of a helicopter! The choice is yours!

The kit is complete down to the nuts, bolts, and washers needed to assemble it. The use of composites and modern manufacturing techniques have allowed us to reduce the number of parts in a Carbon Cub kit to half those of a Super Cub, so the build time is also cut in half. A first time builder should be able to have the entire airframe (wings, tail, and fuselage) ready to cover in about 120 hours. Yes, that is three weeks of your time!

With a Lycoming 160 Hp engine installed the Carbon Cub can weigh as little as 925 Lbs. This results in landing speeds of 29-31 MPH depending on technique. With the high gross option, this results in a useful load of 840 Lbs, or full fuel, full baggage, and two 225 Lb pilots with some room to spare! With the Continental 100 Hp installed in the LSA model, the empty weight will be as little as 845 with a gross weight of 1320, leaving 475 Lbs useful load. With this engine installed the airplane will be airborne in as little as 185 feet and burn 4 to 5 gallons per hour at the normal power settings. For personal transportation it is hard to beat performance like this!

We offer only our "fast build" kit. You should be able to be ready to cover the plane is as little as 120 hours from the time you begin. Covering will take from 150-300 hours depending on your skill level and experience, and then all you will need to do is assemble the parts. The builder is legal to fly the CARBON CUB as a "light sport" pilot as long as the kit is certified at a maximum weight of 1320 Lbs. Our standard kit was tested to ASTM standards at a gross weight of 1430 Lbs, and our high gross kit was tested to 1865 Lbs. If you decide to build to the high gross limit, you will not be allowed to fly as a "Light Sport" pilot, and will need a medical and a private pilots license.

#### AUSTRALIA ISSUES TYPE CERTIFICATE FOR THE CC18-180 TOP CUB

**CubCrafters** is pleased to announce that the **CC18-180 TOP CUB** has received Type Certification from the Civil Aviation Safety Authority in Australia. This certification allows new, certified, ready-to-fly **CC Cubs** to be delivered to customers in Australia for the first time ever. The **CC18-180** was certified in the US in Dec. 2004, and has now been approved on floats and wheels in Canada and Australia as well.

With a useful load of 1100 lbs and its combined versatility and utility, the **TOP CUB** is the ideal vehicle for work or recreation in Australia. The optional Wipline 2100 Amphibious Floats make even the most remote hunting and fishing destinations available for pilots of this modern "Cub". Tundra tires in sizes of up to 35" are approved, and the optional cargo belly pod allows numerous options for up to 350 Lbs of cargo in addition to two people and full fuel.
